

Do I need a Working with Children Check (WWC)?

1. Are you 18 years or over?
2. An active member of Long Reef SLSC inc, or any other Volunteer organisation with child related activities?
3. A patroller, age group manager, coach, or helper who may come into contact with children Under 18 years of age?

If you answered **YES** to all of the above than you **MUST** apply for a Working With Children Check (WWC) number and supply Long Reef SLSC inc with the details.

How do I get a WWC number?

Complete the Online application at www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov. You will then receive an Application number. Print this and take to your local RMS with proof of ID. You will be sent a WWC number by email. Please forward this on to Long Reef's Registrar (registrar@longreef.com) for entering into the Club's WWC register and Surfguard.

Will it cost me anything?

As a volunteer you will not have to pay for this Check. However, if your Occupation involves potential unsupervised contact with Children e.g. nurse, teacher, therapist, then you will need to pay \$80 and also provide your Employer and Long Reef SLSC inc.
